PATTERN FOR BANDAGE ROLLER

—BASE—

**THIS PATTERN IS ACTUAL SIZE
CUT ON SOLID LINES**

1. Use this pattern to cut the bandage roller
BASE from a 1 inch piece of wood.
2. See previous page for other pattern pieces
and directions.

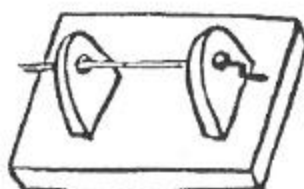

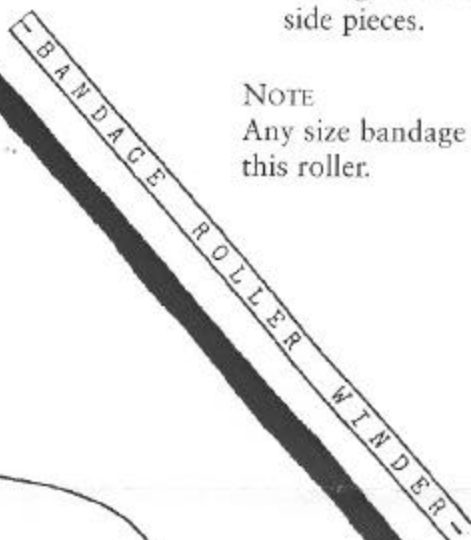

Bandage Roller



COMPLETED
BANDAGE ROLLER

Straighten a wire coat hanger and bend it in half lengthwise. Then bend the doubled piece of wire into the shape shown to the right. This will be the bandage roller winder.

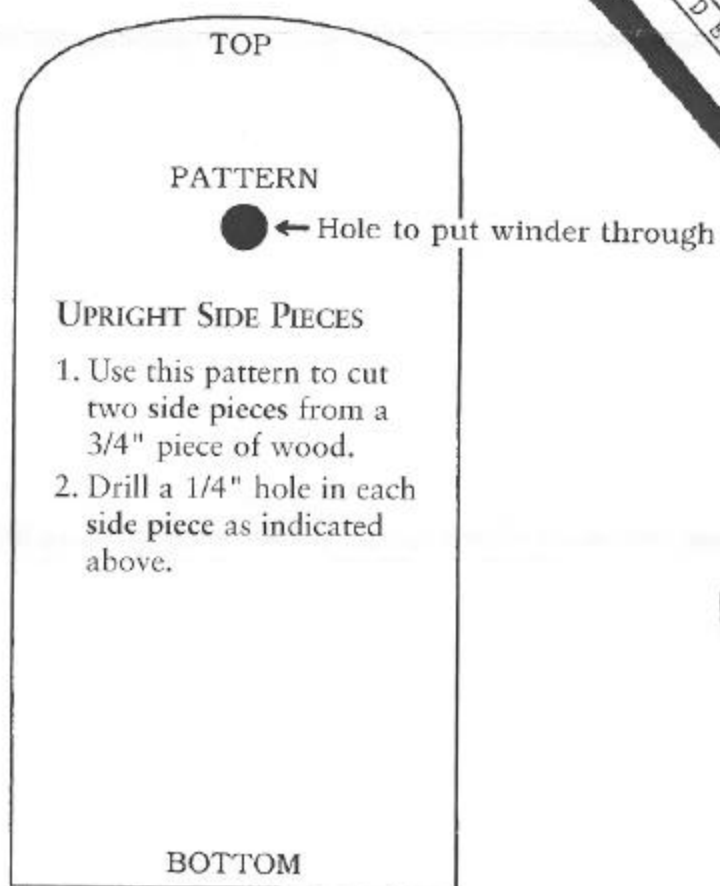


ASSEMBLY DIRECTIONS

1. After cutting the bandage roller base and two side pieces, sand all surfaces if you wish . . . not necessary though!
2. Nail the *bottom* of the side pieces to the base according to the dotted lines on the base pattern.
3. Insert straight end of winder through both holes on upright side pieces.

NOTE

Any size bandage can be rolled on this roller.



UPRIGHT SIDE PIECES

1. Use this pattern to cut two side pieces from a 3/4" piece of wood.
2. Drill a 1/4" hole in each side piece as indicated above.

Bandages

1. KNITTED

- Use #1 needles and one ball of Coats and Clark's "Crosheen."
- Cast on 30 stitches.
- Always slip the first stitch off on each row and knit the other 29 stitches.
- Knit in garter stitch . . . (that is knit every row) using the entire ball of crochet thread.

This makes one bandage.

X 2. ROLLED

- Use old white sheets, cotton or blend.
- Check nursing homes and motels for used sheets.
- Remove top and bottom hems.
- Tear (do not cut) sheets into strips the length of a sheet. Make strips 3" x 108"
- Roll very tightly and evenly with no loose threads at the edges.
- Tie each roll with a piece of cloth or the selvage torn from the sheet.

(Do not use rubber bands, tape or thread)
